

Ethical Principle

- Begin course with an Indigenous Perspective on Permaculture including a story from history encouraging truth and reconciliation and a lesson about how to do traditional land acknowledgement.
- Make the land acknowledgement part of the mapping project.
- Provide a diversity scholarship to create opportunities for indigenous & people of color with financial barriers.
- Share content in the course about Inclusivity and Diversity
- Include content in the course on Decolonizing Permaculture.
- Bring in diverse teachers including queering permaculture.
- Design the teaching team to feature a majority of female teachers.



DECOLONIZE

Make space: listen, include, invite, stand aside. Welcome all voices. Actively listen to what others have to say. Include a diversity of perspectives in decision making and design. Invite participation in the process. Support sovereignty and empower people to take action that brings benefit.

Ways to Be Efficient & Effective

- Some videos filmed on location to reduce video editing costs.
- Some audio only units that people can listen to while cleaning, gardening, walking in the woods or doing other active tasks.
- Film some of the more renowned elder teachers live to lower impact on them.
- Clear communication and delegation of tasks with the team.
- Effective marketing of the program that reflects its value and relevance to appropriate audiences.
- Forum to enable peer learning, guidance and support, especially for doing map and design project.
- Break course into smaller 'stepping stone' courses to lower commitment and cost up front for participants and create more entry points into the program.



Work where it counts. Look for places your work can have the most enduring benefit. Design your work process strategically so you can make the most progress with your investment of time, energy and money.

Limits

Design Web Anchor Point

"Identify the things that might block your path or keep it small or slow it down"

- Looby Macnamara
- Cost and time involved in producing videos.
- Complexity of dealing with a large global teaching team.
- Accessibility for people in the ²/₃ world.
- Cost involved in marketing and promotion.

Flipped or Reframed Limits

- Investing in quality content and slideshows that can be easily accessed and reviewed makes the course better.
- Gentle persistence with the teaching team can help achieve follow through on contributions.
- Share some content and experiences freely with public webinars, downloads and scholarships.
- Utilize content marketing, targeted advertising and organic promotion to streamline budget.

Patterns

Design Web Anchor Point

"Identify the helpful and unhelpful patterns"

- Looby Macnamara
- Good procedures, protocols and workflows updated throughout the process.
- Encourage people to put the course into practice in practical ways where they live.
- Attract an active learning community to motivate and encourage learning.

- Too little structure can result in people not completing the course.
- Over-complexifying the course can make it too expensive to produce and offer.
- Having unrealistic deadlines can drastically change budget and timelines.

- Looby Macnamara
- Certificates for completing each smaller course can create many moments of completion and celebration on the journey towards the full Permaculture Design Certificate.
- Soil Section done by Soil Food Web School scientists.
- Delvin film on location when possible to create more engaging video.
- Perks for keen participants that keep forum and webinar chat lively.

Adam Cobb

- Focus on creating a great student experience.
- Have a strong scientific foundation.

Roger Brignell

- Cohorts of students to create course culture.
- Set up and support a learning community.
- Podcasts that can be subscribed to.
- New content that can be subscribed to
- Social media sharing.

John Ellis

- Short Intro video from each presenter sharing about themselves.
- A motion graphic zooming from space into contributing teacher location.
- Give context and set expectations at the start of the course.

Principles

Design Web Anchor Point

How can we make the course interactive and exploratory. More than just a series of videos and a book of handouts?

- Make live online classroom super interactive with breakout groups, design time, active chat
- Activate a group of keen participants to focus on being responsive in chat
- Forum for sharing maps and designs, activate keen participants to keep this lively





The best learning comes from discovery. Nobody likes to be told what to do. Create opportunities for others to learn through a process of exploration. Add signs to your design site including more questions than answers to inspire the spirit of experiential learning.

Principles

How can the design for the course be ongoing, including participants and Soil Food Web School staff?

- Integrate feedback from participants taking the course as well as from a final survey given to those who complete it.
- Get feedback and comments from student support team regularly.
- Invite students to give feedback at multiple points in the course.
- Mark in calendar regular times to revisit the design, integrate feedback, evaluate successes and challenges and reflect on the design, making course tweaks as appropriate.



PARTICIPATORY DESIGN

Collaborating to co-create a design or plan of action with stakeholders can be empowering and supportive. Use creative facilitation and inclusive methods for having discussions, making decisions, designing and planning together. Supported, successful and unique projects that are well used and cared for can emerge from participatory designs.

Principles

How can we fast track succession and reach tipping points in the successful growth and engagement in the course?

- Invite teaching team to take the PDC while encouraging engagement in forum and promotional sharing on social media.
- Inspire teaching team to promote the course to their networks.
- Activate a facebook group for course participants and alumni.
- Set up a newsletter group for active participants and graduates.



TIPPING POINTS

Change is non-linear. Large bursts of change happen when conditions reach a critical mass. Look for ways to intervene in a system to unlock cascades of change.

I believe the design created is a uniquely diverse, inclusive and effective online PDC. I will continue to evaluate and get feedback from students.



Need : Ongoing course creation is effective and efficient


- Continue finding ways to save money and time.

Key decisions and why they were made

SFWE - Soil Food Web Essentials Course

- Stand alone course co-created by Soil Food Web School top scientist-teachers.
- To take the Soil section of the PDC to the next level with firm foundations in the newest science.
- Fill in missing gap for an accessible course sharing the Soil Food Web approach.

IPC - Introduction to Permaculture

- Deconstruct the past 18 hours of Graham Bell lectures, spread them throughout the whole PDC.
- Bring in diverse content from many different teachers to make the course more dynamic, inclusive and engaging.
- Redo Graham's slideshows to take them to the next level of quality.
- Design the course to fulfill Permaculture Association criteria requirements for issuing a certificate of completion.



Decisions

Key decisions and why they were made

PDC - Permaculture Design Certificate

- Move to succession education with a stepping stone model by breaking it up into a number of shorter courses, each with their own certificate of completion.
- Shorter courses are more affordable, accessible and achievable.
- Break PDC into stand alone courses : Introduction to Permaculture (Foundational Concepts, Design Tools & Frameworks, Patterns), Soil Food Web Essentials (Soil), Gardening, Farming & Foraging (Design with Plants & Trees, Water, Animals), Global Design & Decision Making (Design with Climate, Cool Climate, Tropics, Drylands), and Social Permaculture.
- Bring in more elders of permaculture to up the quality of the course.
- Delvin film on location with video camera instead of at home on the computer to create a foundation of high quality content weaving the course together.
- Grace and Delvin personally invest in some new graphics to help promote the course as well as in their travel costs to film some permaculture elders to help make their contributions possible and high quality.
- Delvin begin volunteering on video work to demonstrate dedication and support to completing the course in as timely as a way as possible.

Evaluation

Goals Achieved

- With 70 contributors from 22 countries we did include a uniquely diverse and inclusive teaching team.
- By breaking the course up into five micro-courses, we did make the course more accessible to people.
- The course took longer than we hoped to create, however we did create something great which will serve the students who take it better .
- With **Graham Bell** spread throughout the course sharing his final permaculture transmission with upgraded slideshows and edited content, he is truly delivering a beautiful final offering to the world supported by many of his students and colleagues.
- My hope is that this will be a regenerative course for the Soil Food Web which will be part of the evaluation after the remaining smaller courses go live along with the full certification that includes all of them.
- We will get feedback from students as to whether they feel they have become better decisions makers who are living in deeper alignment with their values.
- Will see by the map and design projects if the course supported people to get on the ground more and take action where they live.

Tweaks : Permaculture Design Course 2.0

- Go through and rebuild slideshows for early contributor videos to create consistency and upgrade quality
- Consider paying people to re-record if they only provided the tiny thumbnail videos
- Slideshows can be made more dynamic using automated design layouts
- Consider new contributing teachers experience with teaching online which could enable them to produce videos with less editing required
- Refilm permaculture elders who did their presentations on zoom
- Provide contributing teachers video and microphone technology when needed to create high quality recordings
- Find new ways to support and activate the teaching team to stay connected
- Add more 'optional' content
